Venue: University and Business Center at Elgin Community College - As AAUW has deep roots supporting academic opportunities for women, it seems fitting that we should gather for this significant anniversary at an educational institution. The conference center at Elgin Community College (ECC) in Elgin, IL is perfectly poised as the setting for us to come together. Elgin is situated between Chicago and Rockford on the scenic Fox River Valley and home to Elgin Area Branch, an active AAUW-IL branch.


# Novel Approach — APRIL 15, Sue

### **Public Policy, Ken**

#### Spotlight on Politics - Ken Olson - Public Policy chair

Welcome to 2024, another Presidential Election year. It seems we have been hearing campaign rhetoric forever but be prepared for more. In addition to the President all members of the US House and Illinois Assembly will be up for election. Our state Senator, Laura Murphy, is also up for reelection. All elections are important, but this year is especially so as we look to support candidates who will support and work for AAUW priorities, protect women's rights and defend democracy for the future. AAUW is non-partisan, but I would note that all of our current elected officials have done the three things noted above.

Let's look at some important dates relative to the elections:

- The Illinois Primary Election where we select candidates for the fall ballot will be March 19. We hear frequently about the Presidential primary, but the primary includes local and state offices, so it is very important.
- The General election will be Tuesday November 5, 2024
- You must be registered to vote. You can check your status, and register if needed, on the Illinois Board of Elections page <a href="https://ova.elections.il.gov/?ref=voteusa">https://ova.elections.il.gov/?ref=voteusa</a> en . I tried it and it is easy to do.

It is difficult to do much legislatively in an election year, but let's take a brief look at some legislative issues of interest. The IL Assembly is back in session in Springfield. The current session runs to May 24. An important issue for AAUW is paid family and medical leave. Some good news in Illinois as effective Jan. 1nearly all Illinois employees became eligible for a minimum of 40 hours of paid leave per year. This comes from the <u>Paid Leave for</u> <u>All Workers Act</u> that passed last year. Both full-time and part-time employees are covered by this Act. However, employees who work fewer hours may accrue less leave time compared to full time employees. It would be nice to have more than 40 hours and employers can offer more. We have noted in previous articles that last year was good legislatively in Illinois. We need to continue to talk with our representative, submit witness slips and be sure to vote to keep the progress going.

At the federal level, Congress has struggled to do anything meaningful since the GOP took control of the House. They have elected one speaker, threw him out, elected a second speaker and now there is rumbling about removing him. They have been unable to pass the 12 Appropriations Bills needed to fund the government, but thankfully working with Democrats they recently passed their third Continuing Resolution (CR) to fund the government.
