### October General Meeting & Program, Mary & Lynn

In October, we will meet with State Senator Laura Murphy. Senator Murphy's district, which is the 28th district includes parts of Schaumburg and then east to Park Ridge. She will be sharing with us new business in the Senate and the House of Illinois. It is often difficult to keep up with the business of the Illinois legislature because it is not covered well in the press, so she will bring us up-to-date on all the happenings in the legislature. We will meet with her on October 16 from seven until eight. There will be a short business meeting before. Zoom meetings.

### **Public Policy, Ken**

President Biden has had one of the most successful terms of any President relative to the passage of important legislation. His decision to withdraw from the presidential race and the subsequent emergence of Vice President Harris as the presumptive nominee has brought a new energy to the campaign. The fact that VP Harris could be our first female, first Southeast Asian and second Black American elected President is historic. While we are disturbed by the negative campaigning that is certain to come, we look forward to the coming campaign.

Elections are always important, but this one seems more critical than most for our future. There are sharp differences between the parties in their positions relative to DEI, reproductive health care, education and many other issues. It will be important for AAUW members to be knowledgeable and involved in the process.

We have an excellent resource from National. The <u>AAUW Action Fund</u> advances equity for women and girls through member activism and voter mobilization. It includes resources that will be updated as the election season progresses in the following areas.

Looking at Washington DC and Springfield legislative activity will be at a low level in the coming weeks. Congress is on their August recess and return September 9. There should be a flurry of activity when they return as all 12 Federal Budgets remain to be approved as well as the Farm Bill to includes feeding programs like WIC and SNAP. In Illinois the Assembly will be back for Veto Session beginning November 12.

There are many concerns, but one that we have talked about is the status of the new Title IX regulations that are designed to prevent sex-based discrimination in schools. As a result of lawsuits, enforcement of the new rules is now blocked in 21 states and along with hundreds of colleges and universities nationwide. It remains to be seen how this works out, but the elections are sure to have an impact.

One final note. I was appointed to the IL AAUW state board to serve as Co-chair of IL AAUW Public Policy along with Karen Kortsch of the Waukegan branch. We will be working to keep members across the state informed and active in the coming year.
